(b) If, in the Greek text, it was ==>

"And the Word was God" (Greek word order) = support the reading "and the Word was a god" (some lesser kind of deity).

(c) BUT IT'S NEITHER OF THOSE! Here is what the Holy Spirit inspired the Apostle John to write==>

"And God was the Word" - that is, "What God was, the Word was also." Or, as we have it in our English Bibles "and the Word was God."
