

"A Royal Priesthood" (Part 7) 06061Pe2.9(44) 1 Peter 2:9

4 And coming to Him as the Living Stone, having been rejected by men-but chosen by God and precious [to Him]. 5 You also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 6 For it is contained in Scripture: Behold, I Lay in Zion a chosen stone, a PRECIOUS CORNERSTONE; AND THE ONE WHO BELIEVES IN HIM WILL NEVER BE PUT TO SHAME. 7 This honor, therefore, is for you who believe. But for those who disbelieve: THE STONE WHICH THE BUILDERS REJECTED, THIS BECAME THE CHIEF CORNER. 8 And: A STONE OF STUMBLING AND A ROCK OF OFFENSE. They stumble because they are disobedient to the word, unto which [ends] they were appointed. **9** But you are AN ELECT RACE, A ROYAL PRIESTHOOD, A HOLY NATION, A PEOPLE FOR [God's own] Possession so that you might proclaim the excellencies of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light. **10** Once you were not a people, but now [you are the] people of God; [once you were] those who had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

5. The <u>Character</u> of God's People (9a)	
a. An Race	
b. A Priesthood	
Melchizedekian Priesthood	Fulfilled in Jesus Christ
Was a royal priesthood - Melchizedek was a King and a Priest (Gen. 14:18), something unknown among Aaronic priests	Is both Priest and King (Zech. 6:12-14; Heb. 9:11; Rev. 19:16)
Was independent of ancestral ties (Heb. 7:3)	The priesthood of Christ is not dependent upon his being of Aaronic descent (Heb. 7:14)
Was both king of righteousness and king of peace (Heb. 7:2)	Though Christ was have both righteousness (Rom. 10:4; 1 Cor. 1:30; 2 Pet. 1:1) and peace (Acts 10:36; Rom. 5:1; Gal. 1:3; Eph. 2:14; Col. 3:15)
Was timeless in that there is no record of a beginning or a ending	Christ's priesthood is forever (Psalm 110:4, cf. Heb. 5:6, 6:20, 7:17)
Prefigured the future Priesthood of Jesus Christ in that it was superior to that of Aaron (note Abraham, through whom came	Christ's priesthood is superior to all others and infinitely perfect (Heb. 5:1-6, 7:11-28, 9:11-10:18)

"God sovereignly elected all who believe, and by Christ's sacrifice on the cross paid the price to redeem them . . . and the Holy Spirit brought them to new life through conviction of sin and faith in the Savior, Therefore, all believers belong

d. A people for God's own

- (1) KJV = "peculiar people" "peculiar" comes from the Latin *peculiaris* meaning "to possess as in private property"
