1 Peter 2:9c-10

- 4 And coming to Him as the Living Stone, having been rejected by men—but chosen by God and precious [to Him]. 5 You also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 6 For it is contained in Scripture: Behold, I lay in Zion a chosen stone, a precious cornerstone; and the one who believes in him will never be put to shame. 7 This honor, therefore, is for you who believe. But for those who disbelieve: the stone which the builders rejected, this became the chief corner.
- **8** And: A STONE OF STUMBLING AND A ROCK OF OFFENSE. They stumble because they are disobedient to the word, unto which [ends] they were appointed. **9** But you are AN ELECT RACE, A ROYAL PRIESTHOOD, A HOLY NATION, A PEOPLE FOR [God's own] possession so that you might proclaim the excellencies of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light. **10** Once you were not a people, but now [you are the] people of God; [once you were] those who had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.
