 - a. An important grammatical consideration (the connection of anxiety to humility)
 - b. What kind of anxiety is this (note that this same word is used in conjunction with Martha in Luke 10)
 - c. However ALL of our anxieties are to be "cast" or "thrown" upon Him!
 - d. "Cast" (merimna) used in Luke 19:35
