Introduction:

Humble dependence on God's sovereign will is that which carries us through the sufferings of this life to the finish line of faith.

I. How to Persevere Through Suffering (vv.6-11)

A. Humble Yourself Before God (vv.6-7)

- 1. The Transition from verse 5 to verse 6 (from humility toward one another to humility before God)
 - a. Peter's quotation of Proverbs 3:34

Proverbs 3:34 (Hebrew) Though He scoffs at the scoffers, Yet He gives grace to the afflicted. Proverbs 3:34 (Greek LXX) The Lord resists the proud; but he gives grace to the humble.

b. Comparing 1 Peter 4:5-11 to James 4:6-10 (chart)

2. Four Characteristics of this "Humility" (vv. 6-7):

1) It is a Humility that Bows to God's Sovereignty (v.6); 2) It is a Humility that Looks to Eternity (v.6); 3) It is a Humility that Forsakes Worldly Anxiety (v.7); 4) It is a Humility that Rests in God's Care (v.7)

B. Be Aware of your Adversary (vv.8-9)

- 1. You are being hunted: Don't Run, Resist!
- 2. Stay firm in the faith: Guard Your Heart and Your Doctrine

C. Know that you Don't Suffer Alone (v.9)

D. Focus on the Finish Line of Faith (vv.10-11)
