14 Therefore, beloved, since you look for these things, be diligent to be found by Him spotless and blameless, [and] in peace. 15 And consider the patience of our Lord to be salvation, just as also our beloved brother Paul, according to the wisdom given to him wrote to you— 16 As also in all his letters, speaking in them concerning these things, in which are some things hard to understand, which the unlearned and unstable twist, as also the rest of the Scriptures, to their own destruction.

17 You, therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, be on your guard so that you are not carried away by the error of unprincipled men [and] fall from your own steadfastness, 18 But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.   - d. We are to live expectantly: looking forward to the glories of Christ (12-13)

B. "Diligent" ( <i>spoudaz</i> ) = to be zealous, make very effort (aorist imperative) - cf. 1:	10
