  - B. Application: History Repeats Itself (vv. 8-10)
    - 1. Like Immolated Cities (v. 7): The False Teachers are Sensually Deprayed (v. 8a)
    - 2. Like Israel (v. 5) The False Teachers Reject Authority (v. 8b)
    - 3. Like Immoral Angels The False Teachers are Mockers (v. 8c-10)
      - a. Difficult phrase to interpret: Lit. in the Greek text, "slander glories" (doxa)
        - b. Verses 9-10 give a further example
